### 2. Acceptance of Nova Scotia as a Full Member Province

It was clarified that NS will continue to register as Direct Members for the 2014-15 year as membership forms for their province have not been created yet. NS members will receive full insurance coverage.

MOTION #1 AGM B.2 Acceptance of Nova Scotia as a Full Member Province

Jeff moved to accept the Province of Nova Scotia as a Full Member Province of the Canadian Baton Twirling Federation as of September 7, 2014 with the following provisions and rights:

- 1. That Nova Scotia's Non-Profit Society Status Certificate has been received and a copy to be forwarded to the CBTF President.
- 2. The Nova Scotia Chairperson and Technical Chairperson may attend all CBTF meetings with full speaking and voting privileges.
- 3. Nova Scotia's registered athletes may participate in all CBTF sanctioned competitions and events.
- 4. Nova Scotia's registered athletes may represent their province at CBTF national competitions.
- 5. Nova Scotia shall have its own provincial membership form and fees commencing in the 2015-16 season and members shall continue to have insurance coverage through CBTF Direct Membership.

### 5. WBTF/NFNBTA Merger Update

Jeff reported that much progress had been made with the following executive-level face to face meetings being held over the past year as well as one conference call in June 2013:

- Jan 2013 Amsterdam
- Summer 2013 Almere, Netherlands
- Fall 2013 Lignano, Italy
- Summer 2014 Nottingham, England
- Both organizations have established a good rapport all share the same common goals and wish to work towards baton recognition around the world. A world governing body needs to be recognized by Sport Accord as that is the first step towards recognition by the International Olympic Committee.
- Has provided exposure to the different WBTF NBTA coexistence models around the world.
- Agree on the need for a single World Championship
- Have created the International Baton Twirling Federation (IBTF)
- Have initiated plans to hold a combined world championship and will co-host the first Grand
   Prix Aug 10-11, 2015 in Abbotsford, Canada.
- Potential Roadblocks
- NBTA in the USA (a privately held corporation) is a powerful player in WFNBTA and currently doesn't see any benefit to participate in IBTF.
- Financial concerns WBTF is funding everything right now
- International view not shared (travel concerns to international events)
- "union of unions" so not a "merger" countries still get to do their "own thing"
- Need to have all countries adopt the new organization
- There are potentially 40 countries that could form IBTF

#### In Canada

- CBTF needs to develop its own strategy regarding CNBTA
- Should we use the "union of unions" format, merge the two Canadian organizations or sit back and wait to see what the international organizations do?
- Jeff spoke with Kevan Latrace in 2013 but doesn't think the issue was discussed at the 2013 CNBTA AGM. There is a new president and Jeff is not sure if the issue is on their 2014 AGM agenda.
- In the meantime, CBTF needs to actively & vigorously pursue sport recognition in Canada through Sport Canada. It is critical that we have this as WBTF requires this from all its member countries.

#### **Grand Prix**

- First step towards a single World Championships
- Events: solo, 2baton, team
- Age divisions for individual events Junior, Senior, Adult
- One level offered
- Separate divisions for men and women
- Number of competitors allowed per federation:
  - Solo 3 athletes in each age division per federation
    2 Baton 3 athletes in each age division per federation
  - Team 1 team per federation
  - If a country only has one federation (either WBTF or WFNBTA) it may elect to bring 6 athletes in each age division in Solo & 2 Baton and 2 Teams.
  - Vacant spots within our country cannot be filled by the other organization.
  - If an athlete is a member of both organizations (ie: CBTF and CNBTA), they can qualify at both qualifiers and would then choose which organization they represent.

- Rules and Regulations publicly available on WBTF.ORG
- 4 or 5 lanes 2 WBTF judges and 2 NBTA judges per lane
- Use own judging system
- Deadlines:
  - Identify Judges March 15
  - Athlete Entry June 15

## E. OLD BUSINESS

1. Remove reference to World DanceSport Federation affiliation in current bylaws WBTF and its member countries are no longer affiliated with this organization.

### MOTION #6 AGM E.1 World DanceSport Federation

Jeff moved to remove Article M of the CBTF Bylaws and replace it with the following revision:

"The CBTF is a member of the WBTF. Members of the WBTF agree to and accept the principles of the International Olympic Committee ("IOC") and World Anti-Doping Code and its International Standards and related procedures as a condition of membership.

Members of the WBTF, including all athletes, athlete support personnel and other officials within their jurisdiction, accept and recognize the authority of the IOC. It is a condition of membership in WBTF that all related procedures are accepted by all WBTF members and that all athletes, athlete support personnel and all other officials in WBTF are bound by these rules and procedures."

**Effective: Immediately**

### F. NEW BUSINESS

1. Treasurer's Report

Michelle presented the April 1, 2013 – March 31, 2014 fiscal year report.

a. Affiliation Fees - Based on the past year's number of members (1777 less 488 Type E = 1289), Michelle recommended that Affiliation Fees for the 14-15 year will be \$6.50 per member.

### MOTION # 7 AGM F.1a Affiliation Fees

Michelle moved that the CBTF Affiliation Fees for 2014-2015 shall be \$6.50 per member.

b. Public Accountant – Based on new legislation from Industry Canada, a small not-for-profit organization may waive the hiring of a public accountant (approximate cost \$1000 a year). This must be done every year at our AGM. Michelle noted that a complete audit costs several thousands of dollars.

Michelle moved to waive the appointment of a public accountant for the 2014-2015 year.

- c. Finance Committee Michelle recommended that a Finance Committee be struck to review the books. She will have the committee address a Write-Off Policy for uncollectibles. Three names were suggested (Jane Weir, Beth Jamieson and Jean Thibeault) – Michelle will contact and a Board E-Vote held to approve the Committee members.
- d. Start Up Costs for Nova Scotia Kim Jollimore, NS Chair, was asked to leave the room during this discussion. It was noted that \$2000 was provided to Quebec when it became a Full Member Province in order to assist with basic start-up costs and promotion.

#### MOTION #9 AGM F1.d Start Up Costs for Nova Scotia

Michelle moved that CBTF provide the Province of Nova Scotia with \$2000 for basic start-up costs and funds to promote the sport within their province. DIRECTIVE: Nova Scotia to provide a report at the 2015 AGM.

- Reminder that Webinars and TWG meetings need to be sanctioned (location to say: "online by pre-registration")

Maureen, Group Rep, verbally presented her report stating that her time was spent working on the revised pre-event program and the standardized pre-team program. As a member of the Technical Working Group (TWG), she has been in attendance for the conference calls and contributes to those discussions and projects.

Jeff, Website Coordinator, verbally reported that the website needs to be updated however, with the passing of Robin Hills in the spring, nothing has been completed. He will have a full report at the 2014 FBM.
