

Continuing Professional Education and Development (CPED) Program

One component of CBTF's purpose is to foster the development of coaches, judges, and officials, in order to advance amateur twirling in Canada. As a part of this commitment to the sport, CBTF has instituted a Continuing Professional Education and Development (CPED) Program, designed to further this pursuit. The program is effective January 1, 2015, and, at present, relies on coaches, judges, and course conductors to voluntarily participate and report their activities for this program in both development and education.

Each person covered by this program requires a certain amount of education hours and development hours in a rolling three year cycle. If a person is both a judge and a coach, the hours are not cumulative; rather they are combined. The program is designed to set our coaches, judges, and course conductors up for success. Development credits are for "doing what you do". Education credits are for taking part in the ongoing education offered by CBTF and other related or approved programming. CBTF will acknowledge those coaches, judges, and officials who have completed their requirements by an announcement at Canadians.

Here is how it works. The following table shows how many credits you need to maintain your good standing with CBTF.

Please note that the point structure will be reviewed after the program is implemented, to potentially add more categories and adjust points. Points will not be decreased for any activity already taken, should adjustment occur.
